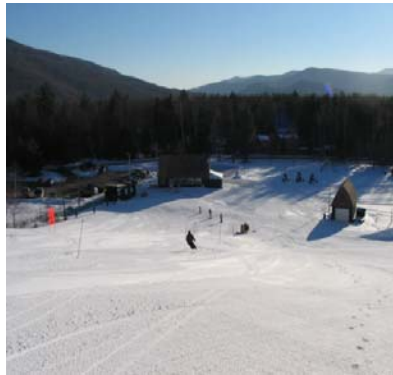

The Beginner ski slope is for beginners only, and is meant to be used by skiers that are not ready for the rope tow yet. There is no charge for use of the beginner ski slope.

The skating rink is an outdoor, uncovered manually flooded rink that is open when temperatures permit. The warming hut is available during the hours that the ski area is open. However, you are welcome to skate anytime from dawn until 9:00 p.m. when the ice allows. There are a limited number of skates, in various sizes, available for use when the warming hut is open. There is no charge for use of the skating rink.

The sledding hill is located to the right of the ski slope. The hill is open for sledding when there is snow. There is no sledding allowed on the ski slope, and doing so could result in a loss of all of your area privileges.

The Recreation Department has received many pairs of donated skis, poles, boots, helmets, skates, and sleds. If you would like to borrow some equipment please see the warming hut attendant. We ask that when you outgrow it, or if you have other equipment that you've outgrown or don't use, that you donate that for others to use!

Sign up now for T-ball, Farm league, Baseball and Softball!

It is now time to sign up for T-ball (4-6 yr olds), Farm League (Coach pitched for 7&8 year olds), softball and baseball (9-12 year olds). If your child played soccer or basketball this school year, and has a current emergency form on file you do not need to fill out a new form. However, if your child did not play last year you will need to bring your child(ren)'s birth certificate(s) in to the Recreation Department, so that we can order a Babe Ruth Id card for them. We will make a copy of their birth certificate and fill out an Id card, and then we will send all of the cards to Babe Ruth Inc. to have them verified. The cards are good until your child is 18 years old, and that means that they will never have to dig out their birth certificates for baseball again! If you have not filled out an emergency form this school year, then you can fill that out at the same time. Call the Recreation Department today.
