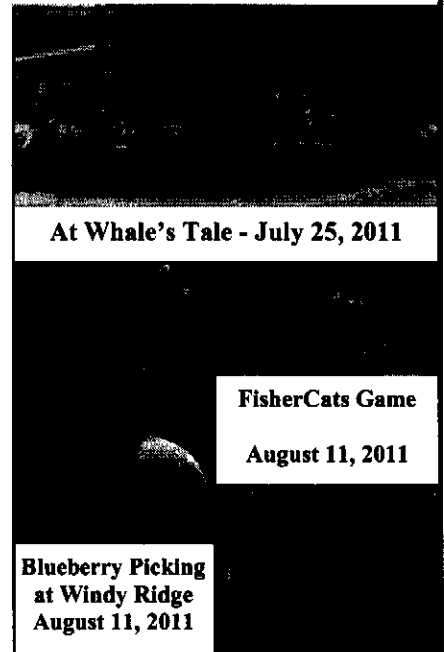

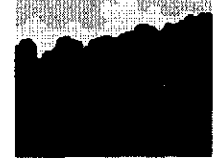

The *Zumba* classes that were being held at the Community Center have ended.

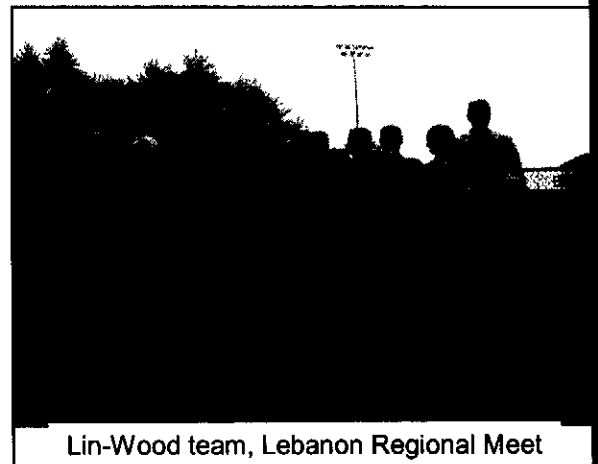
Although the class was originally very popular, it has since dwindled in attendance.

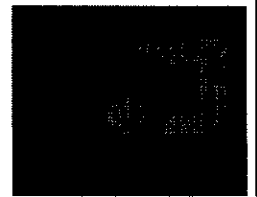
