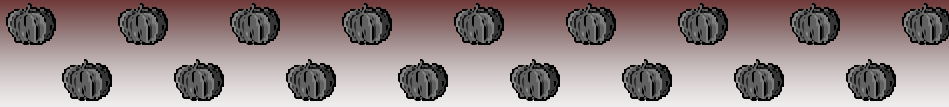

Day Camp 2005:

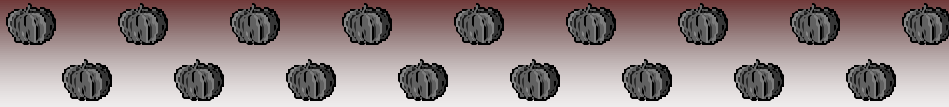

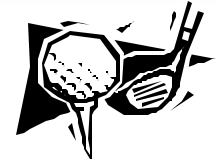

13th Annual Memorial Golf Tournament:



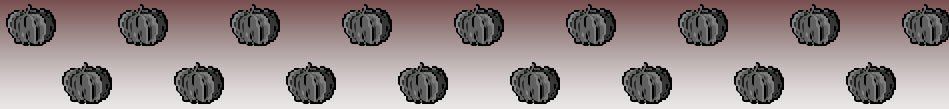

Lincoln–Woodstock Coalition for a Healthy Community:

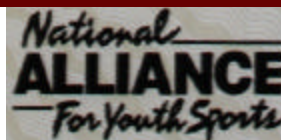

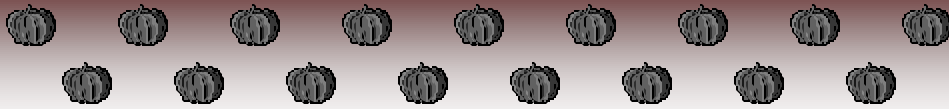

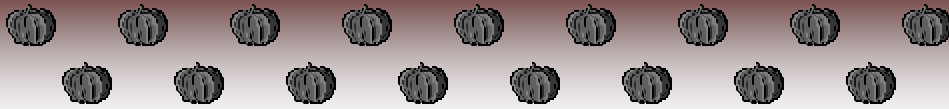
Rotary Donated \$100,000 to Community Center:
