UPCOMING Senior Citizen Day Trips:

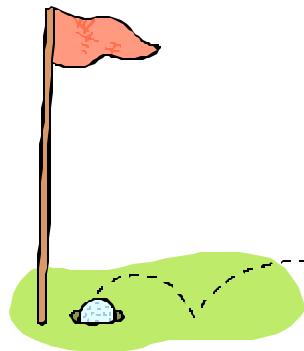

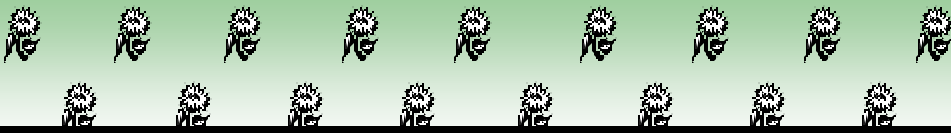
Golf Lessons!

Memorial Golf Tournament:



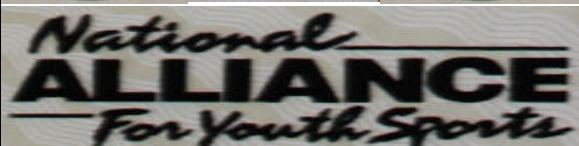
