IV. OLD/NEW BUSINESS

Town Manager's Report

House Appropriations Subcommittee-Emergency Operations Grant:

Carina submitted a preliminary Community Project Funding application to Congresswoman Annie Kuster's Office for a FY23 *Emergency Operations Grant* (\$1M) for the proposed Police/Fire Station. A few weeks back, Kuster's Office was inquiring about community projects in need of funding, and Carina submitted the Police/Fire Station as a potential project. Kuster's Office has subsequently requested additional information regarding the proposed new facility.

National Scenic Byway Grant:

Carina followed up on a Letter of Interest (LOI) that she had submitted to NH DOT for the "Old Hole Recreation Trail & Parking Area" project (NH DOT will be submitting the LOI to the Federal Highway Administration on behalf of the Town of Lincoln) and explained that she has submitted a preliminary application to the NH Office of Planning and Development, and is preparing a formal proposal (final applications due May 6th) for submission prior to the due date. Carina noted that the application includes the construction of a parking area (paved or gravel); earth work, brush/tree removal, signage and maintenance for the trails at an estimated value of \$250k.

Northern Borders Regional Commission Grant (NBRCG):

Carina informed the Board that North Country Council has submitted the 2022 first quarter report to NBRC for the water storage tank project. At this time, the Town is still awaiting a response from Mark Bogosian and his legal team on the proposed easement for the siting of the water tank.

Future BOS Meetings:

The Board of Selectmen will *not* be meeting on Monday, April 25th and Carina presented the board with a few future topics to be discussed as follows:

- May 2nd- 2022 BOS Goals.
- May 9th West Street Gate. Nate will be in to discuss the placement of the gate on West Street.
 The Board suggested that the abutters to West Street all be notified of this discussion so that they have the opportunity to weigh in on the placement of the gate.

Summer Schedule:

Carina presented the Board with a proposed bi-weekly summer schedule starting in June (see attached).

Chenard Junkyard Litigation:

Town Counsel Jason Dennis has attempted to reach out to Attorney Marshall twice in regards to the Chenard Site Visit with no response. Carina is awaiting recommendations for the next steps from Attorney Dennis. Chairman Robinson commented that the Board will have to unilaterally schedule a date for this site visit if no one is responding.

GovOS - Short-Term Rental Management

The Board reviewed quotes from GovOS and Granicus for the Town's Short-Term Rental Management Program. After a brief discussion, the following motion was made:
