III. REVIEW OF BUDGET AND WARRANT ARTICLES WITH TOWN MODERATOR

The Board reviewed the 2020 Warrant Articles with Town Moderator, Robert Wetherell to determine who the primary presenters will be at the Match 10th Town Meeting.

Chairman Robinson explained that Finance Director, Johnna Hart had picked up on a minor discrepancy with Article #8: Operating Budget and Article #11: CR-Engineering & Planning, noting that the Warrant Articles figures did not match with the CIP figures. After a brief discussion, the board agreed to leave the budget as approved by the Budget Committee and Board of Selectmen.

Chairman Robinson further explained that the board needs to appoint an interim Town Clerk to fulfill Town Meeting/Election duties on March 10th. There is one (1) candidate currently running for the Town Clerk's seat, and she is willing to act in an *interim* capacity. With no further discussion, the following motion was made:

IV. LEVEE - US ARMY CORP. OF ENGINEERS (USACE) REPORT

Town Manager Burbank explained to the board that the USACE Report is in, and per Town Counsel this document is now public information. Chairman Robinson read paragraph 7 – Levee Extension (pg. 4) of the report: "The federally-constructed levee embankment ends at approximately levee Sta. 14+48, but the existing embankment extends downstream to approximately Sta. 17+00. The non-federally constructed levee embankment from Sta. 14+48 to Sta. 17+00 is not currently in the PL84-99 Rehabilitation Program, so USACE is not authorized to repair this portion of the levee embankment if it was damaged during a flood event. However, the Sponsor can apply for the non-federal portion to be included in the PL84-99 Rehabilitation Program provided the Sponsor can demonstrate that the non-federal portion was designed and constructed in accordance with the USACE design standards, and provided the Sponsor maintains the non-federal portion of the embankment in accordance with the USACE standards. USACE will contact the Sponsor to discuss the application requirements.

Robinson went on to further explain that the town could seek to add this additional 400 ft. (approx..) of levee embankment to the current portion of the active levee (as requested by resident Richard Sakakeeny), however, noted that the town will then be responsible for the maintenance of this additional embankment, which is *not* part of the original 1960 USACE agreement. Robinson understands the abutting property owners desire for the town to have this portion of the levee added, and feels if the town agreed to the same, there should be a written agreement between the town and the landowners along the 400 ft. embankment, as well as a guaranteed funding mechanism that clearly details the levee owners financial responsibility towards the required maintenance of this levee embankment. Town Manager Burbank also noted that it is unknown as to whether the 400 ft. section of levee embankment currently meets the USACE standards, as it was constructed by an unknown non-federal source.

After a brief discussion, Robinson summarized the three (3) options available: (1) The town declines adding the 400' to its current USACE agreement; (2) the town agrees to do it and funds the entire process, and (3) the town puts the onus on the property owners to find out if the engineering of that portion of the levee complies with the USACE standards (if not, they must find out the costs associated with bringing it up to standards) along with a plan on how the property owners will fund the repair and ongoing maintenance costs.

V. OLD/NEW BUSINESS

Town Managers Report

Town Clerk/Tax Collector's Business Hours

Town Manager Burbank informed the board that the current Town Clerk/Tax Collector's public business hours have changed as follows: Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday from 8am-4pm. The Town Clerk's office will remain closed on Tuesdays until such time a new Town Clerk takes over.

Northern Borders Regional Commission Grant for Water Tank

Town Manager Burbank informed the board that the Town has received a *Notice to Proceed*. The next step for the town is to advertise an RFQ (Request for Qualifications) for the design and engineering aspect of the project, which has been done.

Riverfront Park

Town Manager Burbank explained that his office has received the preliminary plans for the Riverfront Park, and he will be reviewing the plans with Town Engineer, Ray Korber upon his return from vacation (in the next week or two).

OLD/NEW BUSINESS

Short-Term Rental Registration Application

The Board reviewed the draft registration application that Chief Beard and Chief Morris developed. Selectman Ham suggested the town ordinances be listed as bulleted items so that they are clearly listed on the application. Parking, property ownership, contact person's name, advertised bedrooms/bathrooms and other items were discussed.

Health Officer Re-appointment

The board signed the reappointment form for Chief Ron Beard to continue acting as the town's Health Officer/Code Compliance Officer.

Article 02 Amendment to Land Use Plan

Article 02 Planning – Boarding or Rooming House Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 as proposed by the Planning Board of the Town's Land Use Plan Ordinance to:

- 1. Amend Article IV, Definitions of "Boarding or Rooming House" as follows:
- "Boarding or Rooming House": A building or premises, other than a hotel, inn, motel, or Bed and Breakfast, where rooms are let which are used primarily for sleeping and toiletry; for not more than twelve (12) persons (not including the property owner and their immediate family) provided that the house is also occupied as an owner-occupied private residence; not open to transient guests; in contradistinction to hotel, inn, motel, or Bed and Breakfast, which are open to transients. The owner-occupied provision shall not apply in the General Use (GU) District. A Boarding or Rooming House is a business use and requires Site Plan Review approval with a conditional use permit.
- 2. Amend Article V General Regulations, Section A, paragraph 1, Parking and Off-Street Loading, subparagraph c pertaining to parking for "Boarding or Rooming House" as follows: Section A. PARKING AND OFF-STREET LOADING. Adequate off-street parking facilities (municipal parking facilities excluded) for employees as well as customers and off-street loading facilities shall be provided whenever a new use is established or any existing use is enlarged in accordance with the following specifications:
- 1. All proposed new construction shall provide for adequate off-street parking spaces in accordance with the following standards, subject to modification by the approval of a special exception pursuant to Article V, Section A,3. A single parking space is defined as being one hundred seventy (170) square feet in area and having additional adequate area for maneuvering. c. Hotel, Motel, Tourist Accommodation, Lodging Unit, Boarding or Rooming House one (1) space for each unit.
