He explained that this had originally been scheduled as an 18 informational meeting, but due to time constraints with the upcoming Town Meeting, tonight 19 would be the public Bond Hearing, followed by a Budget Committee Meeting, followed by a 20 Board of Selectmen's meeting. 21 22 Vicki Martin explained the scope of the project via a PowerPoint presentation, including the 23 reasons why it is important. 24 25 Safety reasons – there have been studies in other towns and cities showing that after a 26 sidewalk installation, crashes between vehicles and pedestrians were reduced 74-88% • This would complete the downtown sidewalk network 27 This would encourage healthy lifestyles and is already used as part of a local fitness loop, 28 hosting many 5k's, etc. 29 30 This would provide mobility impaired assistance and safety She encouraged people to attend Town Meeting and stay for the whole meeting. She is in favor 31 of doing the project as soon as possible, no matter which financing option is chosen. The Bond 32 33 article would be discussed early in the meeting, but requires a 2/3 vote. If that were not to pass, she'd like people to vote for the taxation version, which would come up at least one hour later. 34 35 Engineer Ray Korber, whom the Town has worked with often, spoke about the infrastructure, and 36 the need to minimize both cost and impact. From Church Street to Dodge Place, we would need 37 a new survey, while we have newer information from Dodge Place to the end of Pollard Road by 38 39 the Kancamagus Lodge. He felt that many conversations would have to be had, both in 40 individual and group sessions, as there may be the need to move utility poles and hydrants, etc. 41

43 Public Participation:

- Would the road be widened? No, the road would remain the same width, but the sidewalk would be next to it, widening the lanes and removing pedestrians from the travel lane.
- How about turning the road into a one-way street and using the other lane for a sidewalk? Or turning the road into 2 one-way portions, going in opposite directions from Maple or Church Street? A stripe alone would not be safe without a barrier. Also, any change in the traffic flow on Pollard Road would result in NHDOT becoming involved, as that would affect Main Street. This would result in Main Street becoming 4 lanes, 2 lanes in each direction, with no on-street parking left available.
- What would the tax impact be this year with either payment version? With the bond, the tax impact this year would be \$0.07 per thousand of property valuation, while with the taxation plan, the impact would be \$0.67 per thousand. The bond would carry on for 10 years, at a slightly reducing impact, while the taxation plan would only affect this year's bill. On an average valued home of \$250,000, the taxation plan would cost an additional \$167.50.
- Could one keep the sidewalk all on one side? What if there are multiple crossings? Which side would be preferred? Although one side would be optimal, we would need to weigh cost to move utilities and property owner's impact. If the sidewalk were all on the southerly side, connecting to School, Church and Maple Streets, it would also have crossings at Mountain View condos and the Kanc Lodge. Cross walks could slow traffic.
- Could we do any work in house? Although Public Works has the forms, the department head does not see any available time for the next few years, as they are working on repairing old sidewalks. With year-round maintenance of the sidewalks now scheduled, that has eaten into their schedule.

Board of Selectmen Chairman Robinson closed the Public Bond Hearing Meeting at 8:17pm, and the majority of the audience departed.

At 8:22pm, Budget Committee Chairman Mike Simons announced the continuation of the Budget Committee meeting from February 2nd.

If the selectmen agreed with the Budget Committee's changes, she didn't want it to look like the Budget Committee just rubber-stamped the Selectmen's choices. OJ explained that new 97 98 information had come to light after the Selectmen were finished with their portion of this project back in November, such as fuel cost reductions, etc.. Each change made by the Budget 99 Committee would be reviewed to see if the Selectmen also agreed. 100 101 Mary Conn suggested adding a column showing expended figures on the budget sheets for each 102 department. This seemed like a good idea to incorporate into next year's process. 103 104 David Beaudin commented that he didn't feel it was fair to hire someone after removing 105 someone from a different position last year. Tamra said that the former Director of Public Works 106 had suggested adding a part-time position, and David clarified that the part-time position was 107 proposed as entry level, while the new part-time person in that department was not being paid 108 entry level. Butch said that there had been no discussion of hourly rate per position, as the salary 109 would be pro-rated between the two departments in which that person would be working. 110 Beverly and Tamra reminded the group that the budget committee can only focus on funding, not 111 employee positions.
